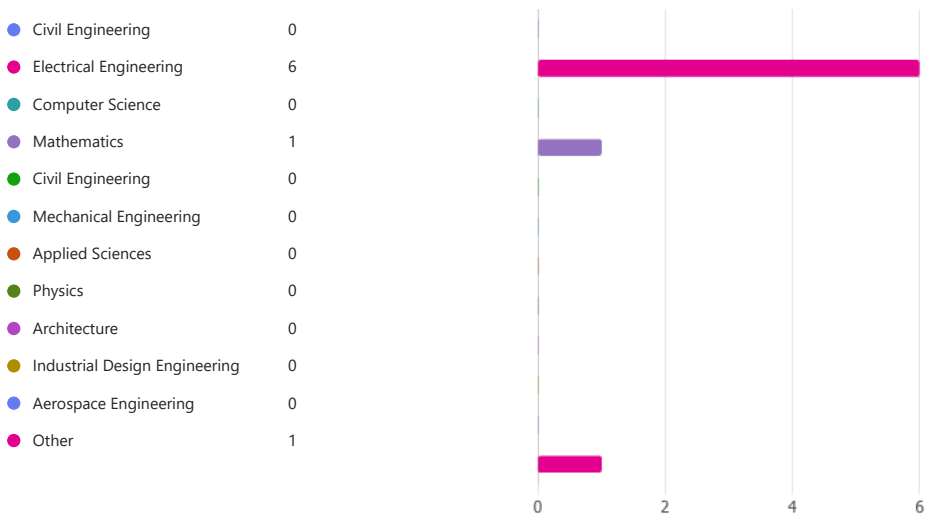

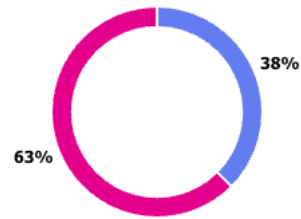

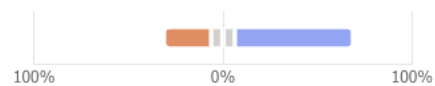

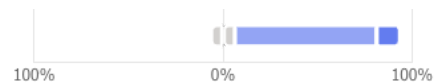
6. How important do you believe it is to integrate ethics into your discipline?

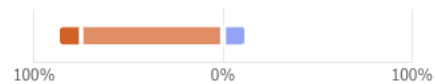
7. Do you believe teaching ethics can positively impact students' professional development?

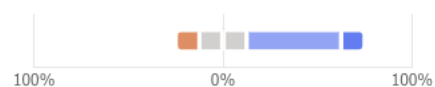
8. How often do you address ethical topics in your teaching?

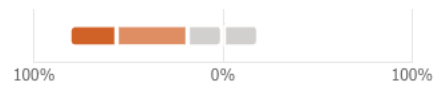
9. How difficult do you find it to integrate ethics into technical courses?

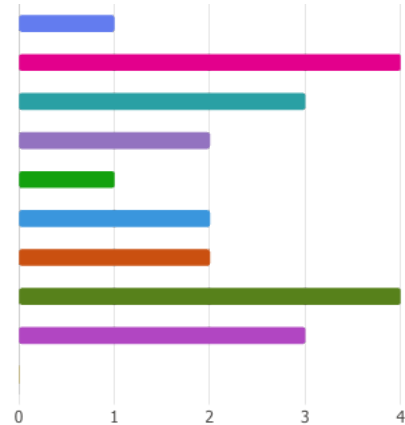
10. How confident do you feel about teaching ethics in your current courses?

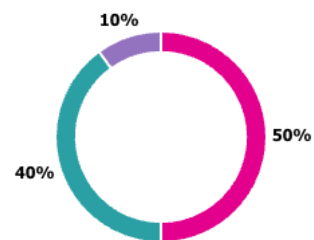

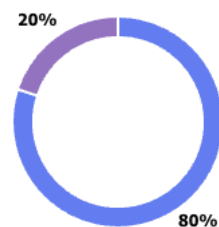

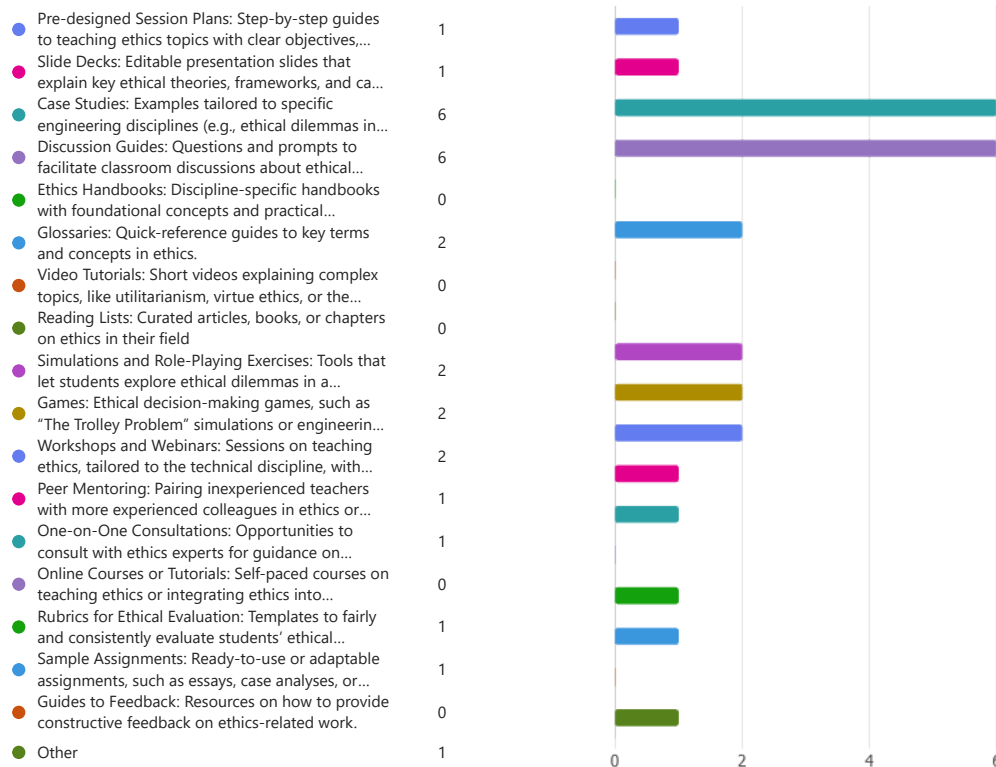
